Open burning of material is prohibited in Montgomery County except under certain circumstances. In these cases, a permit is required from the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) and/or strict guidelines must be followed. Please refer to the link below for information about open burning in the County, including how to apply for a burn permit or file a complaint about illegal burning.

The following items may not be burned in the County at any time:

- Household trash
- Tires
- Construction debris
- Asphalt shingles and tar paper
- Leaves, lawn thatch, and garden trimmings
- Green brush and other fresh or dried plant life (except certain agricultural materials)
