Fall Clean-Up

October 27 – November 6, 2017

A dumpster for Bulk Trash disposal will be available to Town Residents October 27 – November 6, 2017. The dumpster will be placed on the Schoolhouse parking pad along North Street.

NEW THIS YEAR: Curbside bulk trash will be available on Wednesday, November 1, 2017. Residents must schedule bulk collections 1 week in advance with the Town Clerk. Email clerk@townofbrookevillemd.org or call 301-570-4465. All items must be placed at the curb by 7:00 AM on the day of collection.

What items are not accepted in bulk trash?

- Propane tanks
- Uncovered glass mirrors/table tops
- Debris generated from major construction, remodelings, demolition or repair work like bricks, concrete, lumber, non-metal fencing, shingles, drywall, paint, rock, sod, auto parts, tires, non-metal kitchen cabinets, sheds and large dog houses, etc.
- Dirt, yard debris, rocks, tree trunks
- Hazardous materials
- Human or animal fecal or uriferous matter; infectious waste; dead animals
- Large items that will not fit in the dumpster
