Green Tips of the Month

Yard Trim (grass, leaves, and brush)

What can I do with yard trim in my own yard? Compost your leaves and grass

Composting is a great way to turn your yard trim into a wonderful soil-enricher for your lawn and garden

Composting is the decomposition of plant remains and other once-living materials to make an earthy, dark, crumbly substance that is excellent for adding to houseplants or enriching garden soil. It is the way to recycle your yard and kitchen wastes, and is a critical step in reducing the volume of garbage needlessly sent to landfills for disposal.

<u>Get a compost bin</u> - The Town has free compost bins available for Town Residents. The compost bins come in tight rolls, secured with a cardboard wrapper, for transport. The rolls are about 3 feet long and 6 inches in diameter and are easy to carry.

Where can I drop off my yard trim? You may bring yard trim to the Shady Grove Processing Facility and Transfer Station, 16101 Frederick Road, Derwood MD 20855 There is no charge for material that you bring from your own home.

BURNING LEAVES, LAWN THATCH, AND GARDEN TRIMMINGS CAUSES AIR POLLUTION AND IS PROHIBITED IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY

Residents are reminded that burning leaves, lawn thatch, and garden trimmings outdoors is prohibited in Montgomery County because open burning creates air pollution that can directly affect the health and wellbeing of nearby citizens.

The air pollution created by open burning can directly affect the health and well-being of people who live or work near the burn sites by aggravating respiratory conditions, irritating eyes and lungs, obscuring visibility, and creating annoying odors. Smoke is dangerous for people with respiratory diseases like asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, and pneumonia because it can aggravate the symptoms of these diseases.

Air pollution from open burning can also cause property damage to nearby residential and commercial property. Open burning also contributes to regional air quality problems by releasing fine particulate matter, carbon monoxide, volatile organic compounds, nitrogen oxides, and air toxics.

Recycling pickup is on Tuesday and trash is collected on Wednesday, unless otherwise noted. Please have your bins curbside by 7:00am on the respective day.
