HOLIDAY SAFETY TIPS

If you are traveling:

- Get an automatic timer for your lights.
- Ask a neighbor to watch your home, shovel snow and park in the driveway from time to time.
- Don't forget to have mail and newspaper delivery stopped. If it piles up, it's a sign you're gone.

If you're out for the evening:

- Turn on lights and a radio or TV so it looks like someone is home.
- Be extra cautious about locking doors and windows when you leave, even if it's just for a few minutes.
- During the holidays don't display gifts where they can be seen from outside.

Disposing of boxes after the Holidays: Cardboard packaging from holiday gifts or significant purchases, such as electronics, appliances, or computers can be invitations to break-ins. Reduce this risk by:

- Removing information about the make, model, and serial number of your item from the box. Cut out this information and save it with your records.
- Preparing the cardboard for recycling. Flatten and bundle the cardboard. It may be tied with twine, or
 placed into smaller cardboard boxes. Please do not use plastic bags, because it causes problems with
 the recycling process. Once bundled, the packaging will no longer advertise what you have just bought
 to people walking or driving down your street looking for information.

If you're shopping:

- Stay alert and be aware of what's going on around you.
- Park in well-lighted space, and be sure to lock the car, close the windows, and hide shopping bags and gifts in the trunk.
- Avoid carrying large amounts of cash, pay with a check or credit card whenever possible.
- Deter pickpockets and purse-snatchers. Don't overburden yourself with packages. Be extra careful with purses and wallets. Carry a purse close to your body, not dangling by the straps. Put a wallet in an inside coat or front pants pocket.

If a Stranger Comes to your Door...Beware

Criminals sometimes pose as couriers delivering gifts. It's not uncommon for people to try to take
advantage of others' generosity especially during the holidays by going door-to-door for charitable
donations when there's no charity involved. Ask for identification, and find out how the funds will be
used. If you aren't satisfied, don't give. Help a charitable organization you know and like instead.

Emergency Preparedness Survey

At November's Commissioners Meeting, Town Residents Fred Teal, Jr. and Debbie Wagner requested residential emergency preparedness be included as an agenda item. The Town Residents made this request due to concerns raised during last winter's weather and this year's summer storms. In response, the Town Commissioners approved doing basic research to inventory needs and resources that Residents of the Town of Brookeville might want to register in cases of severe weather or snow interruptions such as we had with last winter's blizzards and this summer's violent windstorms. If Town Residents are willing to complete this survey, the information can be used within the Town population to pinpoint neighbors who should have someone check in with them when power's out or travel is impossible, and neighbors who might take initiative to support the community in managing households' needs if the County and State resources are late in coming or aren't operative.

STREET LIGHTS

If you notice a Pepco street light that is out, please look for a metal strip on the wooden pole that has the pole number and report the location of the street light to the Town Clerk. If the wooden pole does not have a pole number, please report the location of the street light.

The Town also operates several cast iron ornamental street lights and 3 wooden ornamental street lights. These ornamental street lights do not have pole numbers. If you notice an ornamental street light that is out, please report the location to the Town Clerk.

Snow Removal

The Town of Brookeville contracts with a snow plowing service for North, South, Water, the eastern portion of Market and paved section of Church Streets. During a snowstorm, no plowing begins until an accumulation of 4 inches of snow has fallen on the streets. The Maryland State Highway Administration clears Georgia Avenue (Maryland Route 97) - the Town's High Street and western Market Street and Montgomery County does the same for eastern Market Street where it switches from Brighton Dam Road.

Those residents and businesses with abutting sidewalks are responsible for clearing their sidewalks, driveways and entrances within 24 hours of the end of a snowstorm. All residents are strongly encouraged to be good neighbors by clearing the sidewalks in front of their homes, as well as assisting those who may not be physically able to do so.
