State Highway Administration Meeting

A meeting involving the Commissioners, District 3 SHA staff, and representatives from Salem Methodist Church was held to discuss removal of the unsafe and declining maple trees at the church cemetery. The trees will be taken down by the SHA. The Commissioners are considering planting new trees and perhaps brick-pavers at the historic site where a Town gateway sign is now installed. The Commissioners also discussed with the SHA curbing, water run-off problems, sidewalks, and the unsafe asphalt condition at the High and Market Streets intersection.
