Think Composting

After a very wet summer and early fall, the leaves are finally beginning to change colors and are falling from the trees. Get ready to compost those leaves in your yard. Why compost leaves? There are many good reasons:

- Leaves are a great source of carbon, an essential element in the composting process. Composting reduces the need to rake leaves and put them in paper lawn bags or reusable containers for curbside recycling collection.
- Yard trim materials are composted into a nutrient-rich soil amendment.
- Mixing a soil amendment into your soil reduces run-off due to rain and melting snow.
- Composting reduces the need to purchase and use commercial fertilizers that can be overapplied and enter our waterways.



Compost your yard trim materials today. Help protect the environment and reduce the amount of yard trim materials set-out for recycling collection. Reduce, reuse and recycle more now for cleaner land, air, and water.
