# Parking Ordinance

## **Update: Ordinance Passed**

New Parking Regulations in the Town of Brookeville

On Monday, July 17, 2023, the Town Commissioners unanimously passed the proposed parking ordinance with edits. The Parking Ordinance can be viewed here: https://townofbrookevillemd.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/07/Brookeville-Ordinance-No.-2023-02 FINAL.pdf

When do the changes in parking take effect? The Parking Ordinance is enforceable on August 6, 2023.

How will Residents know if they violate any provision in the Parking Ordinance? For any existing conditions which violate the Parking Ordinance, written notice of the violation will be provided within 7 (seven) days of the adoption date.

Is there a grace period before enforcement? Yes. There will be a 30-day grace period before enforcing this ordinance after such written notice is provided. The grace period will be until Tuesday, September 5, 2023.

How will the Parking Ordinance be enforced? Will someone be driving around the Town just looking for violations? Parking violations are mainly complaint driven. The Town Commissioners will respond to complaints that are filed with the Town.

Can people make complaints about possible violations without giving their names? Yes, complaints can be filed anonymously or confidentially if they want to hear back on a complaint.

#### David C. Yinger October 6, 1926 - July 18, 2023



## A Remembrance

David Clarence Yinger passed peacefully on July 18 (age 96) at the Casey House in Rockville, MD. David spent his final years at Alfred House I in Rockville, where staff provided loving care as Alzheimer's worsened.



David Clarence Yinger was born October 6, 1926, in Frederick, Maryland, to Lewis and Fannie Ray Yinger. The family lived briefly in Washington, D.C., until his mother became sick, and they moved back to Frederick. David's parents divorced, and in 1937, David's mother passed away when he was 11 years old. He then went to live with his father in Brookeville, MD. David was a student at Sherwood Elementary School, but when David was 13, his father pulled him out of school and put him to work in his bricklaying business. David worked for his father as a laborer, never laying one brick but he watched closely and learned the skills of his father.

When he was 18, David joined the U.S. Army during WWII. He was on his way to Japan when the war ended. He was sent to Guam to finish out his duty. He served 18 months in Guam as a cook and baker known for his fresh coconut pies. After he was discharged, he met Evelyn Saylor in Olney in March 1947 during a sledding party with friends. David and Evelyn got married on February 28, 1948. David started his own bricklaying business in 1951. David spent many years building hundreds of brick homes, fireplaces, patios, chimneys. They had four children: Peggy, David, Gregory, Jeffrey (deceased), and 2 grandchildren: Scott Garrish and Shyanne Yinger. David and Evelyn loved the Town of Brookeville where they raised their children and lived for the rest of their lives. The Yingers were always having parties and picnics, using the swimming pool, going to antique car shows. His beloved Evelyn died in 2006.

David leaves behind many nieces and nephews whom he loved very much. His sisters and brother have gone many years before. He loved his uncles. David loved Brookeville, his Legion, and antique cars. He loved auctions. David loved to collect 'stuff' to display in the house and his fabled museum. A connoisseur of marbles, he displayed a huge collection that delighted visiting children of all ages. He had so many friends and loved spending time with them all. He loved singing and playing music in his 'hillbilly band' *The Brookeville Hillbillies*, where he played the bass and sang in his beautiful tenor voice. He loved to do things for the betterment of his hometown, always helping at the Hospital Supper, joining in the parades, and frequently sitting with friends at "senior MacDonalds" breakfasts.

David was a life member of the American Legion (Norman Price Post 68) who recently celebrated his 73<sup>rd</sup> anniversary there. Over the years, he served as Commander and as Sargent of Arms, reflecting his deep commitment to the Legion. For many years, he belonged to the Sugarloaf Mountain Region of the Antique Automobile Club of America. David loved to drive his 1964 1/2 gold color Mustang convertible, chauffeured in later years by honored friends.

David was a very cool guy, always had a joke or a story to tell from his long life.
