State of the Town A Summary of the Semi-Annual Town Meeting

Town Residents joined the Town Commissioners and Staff via Zoom on Monday, February 12, 2024, to hear an update on the Town.

BPC Update

- Parcel 770: The sub-division process for the 4.3 acres of land adjacent to the cemetery is expected to move forward this Spring.
- 1 High St: The BPC has been working with the owner for the redevelopment of the site. The owner has a HAWP, and the owner will need to submit a Historic Use Permit with a parking plan before the Town approves the project.
- RFP for East Market St.: the Request for Proposal for the redesign of Market Street is expected to be released in the next few weeks.

Bypass Update and Post-Bypass Era Plans

- Currently, SHA retains ownership of MD97 through Town.
- Commissioners are working with SHA on sidewalks throughout the Town, redesigning the Market, High, and Water Streets intersection, and dropping the speed limit on MD97 by 5 miles per hour.
- The Commissioners also provided SHA with a "punch list" of items that need to be completed, mainly the removal of signage.

Town Infrastructure

- Regular maintenance is being performed at the Schoolhouse and the Academy.
- A grant has been applied for to repoint the masonry walls of the Academy.
- Streetlights: The Commissioners are working with Pepco to change all Pepco streetlights to one design with an LED light fixture. The Town will apply for a grant to replace the Town owned cast-iron street lights from High Pressure Sodium lights to energy efficient LED lights.

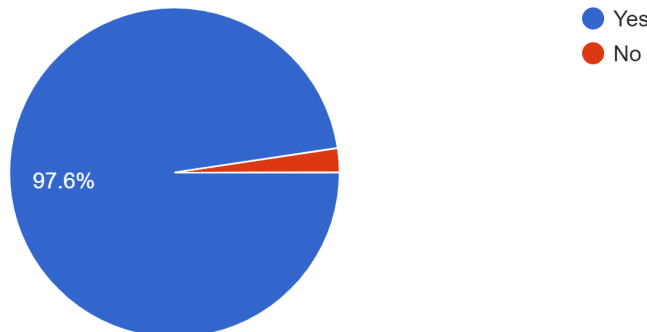
Notes:
 YTD Operating Revenue is 57% of Annual Budget. Annual Revenue Forecast slightly ahead of FY24 Budget. Rental Income below plan but increasing activity.
 YTD Operating Expense is 43% of Annual Budget. Items of note are that building and systems maintenance items are significantly under plan. We do anticipate increasing maintenance activities this spring/summer.
 YTD Capital Expenditures amount to \$18.5k. Capital Revenue - Grant Income of \$800k and expected Cap Expenditures of 1.1M are Budgeted but not incurred to show the Town project costs in future years.

A total of 43 people responded to the modifications to Water Street survey and here are the results:

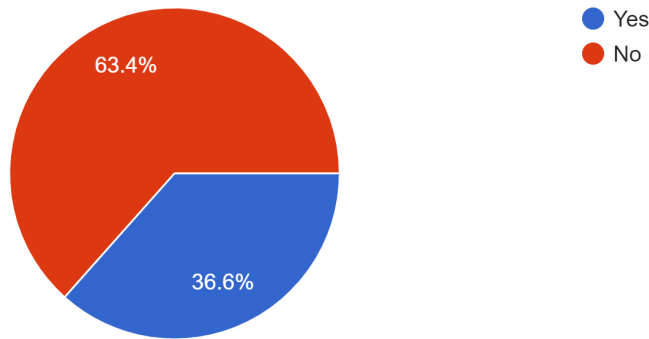
1. Do you live in the municipal boundaries of the Town of Brookeville?

42 responses



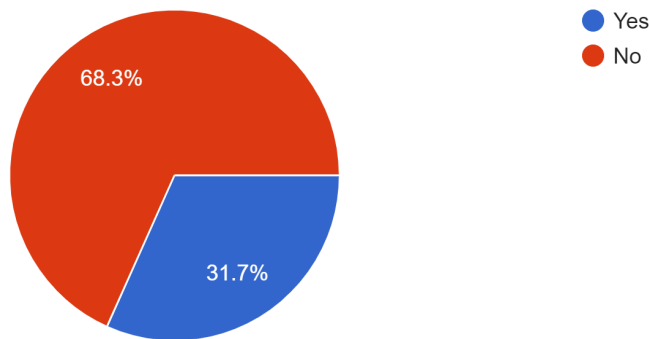
2. Do you currently live on Water Street or regularly (at least 2 times per week) drive or park any of your vehicles on Water Street?

41 responses



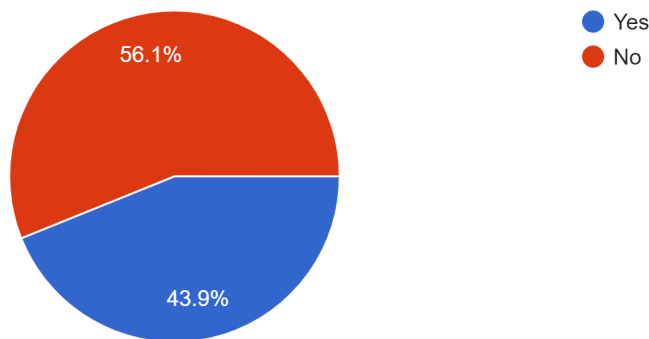

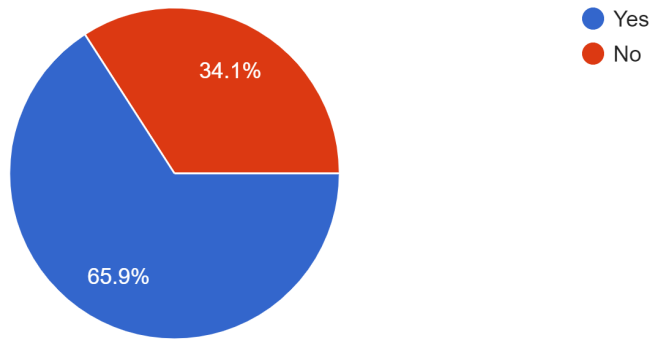
4. Do you believe it is the Town's responsibility to keep parking spaces on Town public right-of-way in locations that have been historically treated as exclusive resident parking?

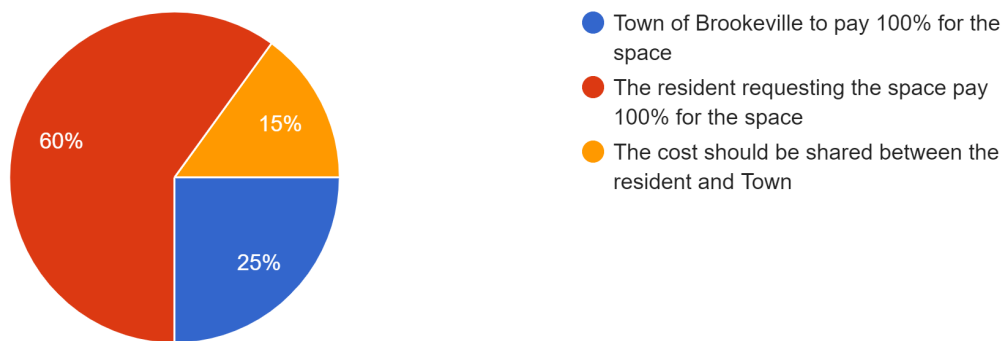
6. Is it appropriate for the Town to move or remove parking spaces on town right-of-way being used exclusively by residents for safety, accessibility, and/or other priorities?

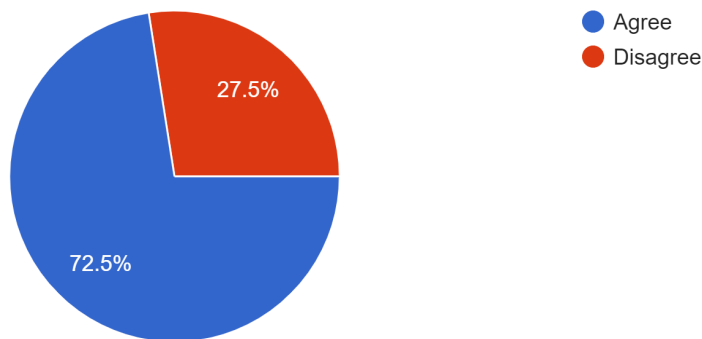
7. If a resident requests additional parking be added on Town right-of-way, who should pay for the space and maintain it?

40 responses



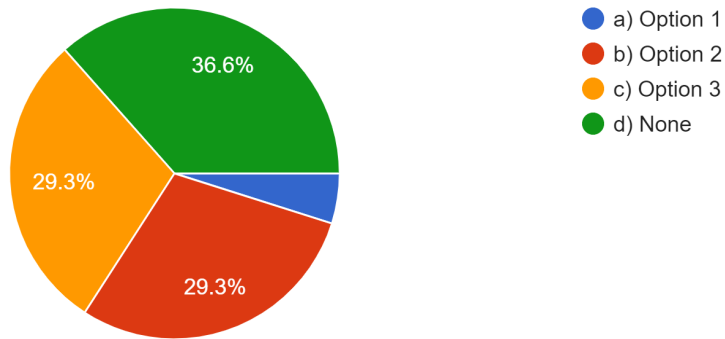
8. Town installed and maintained parking on public right-of-way is public property and should be treated as public parking and not necessarily reserved for specific residents.

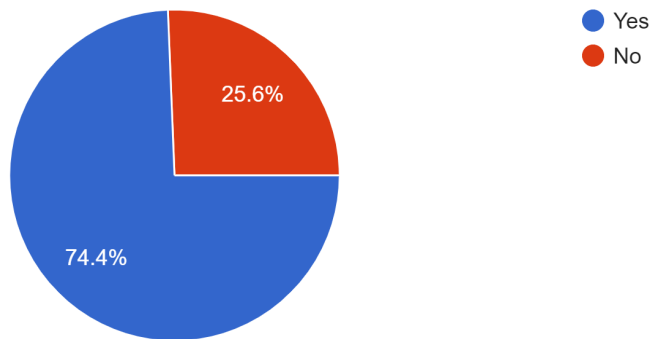
11. Of the three options provided for Water Street Parking modifications provided by the BPC at the end of this survey, which option do you feel would ...o address the issues described in the description?

Street Sign Restoration

We want to inform you about an upcoming project that will enhance the safety and aesthetics of our community: the restoration of our street signs throughout town.

Starting this month, the Town of Brookeville will begin a comprehensive street sign restoration initiative to repaint and repair our existing street signs. We have already received the Market Street sign that we sent in a couple of weeks ago, and we think it looks great!

The rehabilitation process is expected to take 4-6 weeks once the signs are taken down. During this period, you may notice certain streets without their usual signage. We apologize for any inconvenience this may cause and appreciate your understanding as we work to improve our town infrastructure.

Need an Absentee Ballot? You must request an Absentee Application no later than April 23, 2024.

An informal written request for an absentee ballot may be submitted to the Supervisor of Elections, and it must contain the following information:

1. Voter's name
2. Residence address
3. Address to which the ballot is to be mailed, if different from the residence address
4. Voter's Signature

Town Awarded Mini-Grant



Heritage Montgomery awarded the Town a Mini-Grant of \$2,150 for the installation of a new sign directing visitors to parking.

The Town will install the new sign at the corner of High and Church Streets to direct visitors where to parking. The sign will hang from on a pole to match the cast iron streetlights.

Montgomery County Historic Preservation Tax Credit

APPLICATIONS ARE DUE BY APRIL 1, 2024

The Montgomery County Historic Preservation Tax Credit was established by Montgomery County to assist owners of locally designated properties with routine maintenance and repairs exceeding \$1,000 in cost. The Town of Brookeville is listed in the Montgomery County Master Plan for Historic Preservation. All homes within the Town's municipal boundaries are eligible to apply for the Historic Preservation Tax Credit.

Examples of eligible projects include, but are not limited to,

- Painting
- Repairing roofs or windows or replacing them in-kind
- Repairing architectural trim or ornament
- Repointing brick or stone foundations or chimneys
- Restoring a documented feature such as a dormer or porch that was previously altered or removed
- Repairing and maintaining outbuildings such as barns and garages

NOTE: New construction and interior work are not eligible.
